







Math Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard







3rd Grade Reading Proficiency










2021-2022 RECLASSIFICATION RATE OF EMERGING BILINGUAL STUDENTS



Reclassification Rate (December 2021)



DISTRICT ANNUAL YOUTHTRUTH SURVEY 2020-2021


Percent Positive Responses




