DECLARING THE MONTH OF MAY "NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH MONTH"

WHEREAS mental health is essential to everyone's overall health and well-being; and

WHEREAS behavioral health disorders, including major depression, schizophrenia, panic disorders and obsessive-compulsive disorders affect many children and youth every year, regardless of age, gender, race, ethnicity, religion or economic status; and

WHEREAS federal statistics show that one in 10 children has a serious mental health condition, but only a third will receive any care at all — with even fewer receiving appropriate care; and

WHEREAS a focus on prevention and early intervention efforts could greatly reduce the number of children experiencing serious mental health condition; and

WHEREAS children, youth, and adults can recover from mental illness and lead full, productive lives in the community; and

WHEREAS students had been experiencing widespread mental-health distress long before the COVID-19 pandemic took hold, with youth suicide on the rise and the second leading cause of death for 15- to 24-year-olds; and

WHEREAS the pandemic has made matters worse; in surveys, students reported that COVID-19 has impacted their lives through increased isolation, loneliness, stress, and sadness; and

WHEREAS every person and community can make a difference in helping end the silence and stigma that for too long has surrounded mental illness and discouraged people from getting help; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Azusa Unified School District Board of Education that May is designated as Mental Health Awareness Month.
