Whereas: Azusa Unified School District believes that we have a special

the teaching of tolerance and understanding, and the value and

strength of diversity; and

Whereas: Asian American and Pacific Islander communities are suffering acts of

discrimination, hate crimes, and macroaggressions due to fears of COVID-

19; and

Whereas: scientists have confirmed that the COVID-19 disease does not respect

> borders, and the World Health Organization has cautioned against using geographic descriptors because they can fuel ethnic discrimination; and

Whereas: Azusa Unified School District is especially aware of the trauma and

isolation that is accompanying the COVID-19 global pandemic; and

Whereas: Azusa Unified School District affirms its commitment to the safety

> and wellbeing of our Asian American and Pacific Islander community members and ensures that they are not alone and will be supported in

helping to stop the spread of xenophobia; and

Whereas: Azusa Unified School District stands in solidarity with our Asian

American and Pacific Islander communities: and

Whereas: Azusa Unified School District stands against discrimination among

all persons regardless of national origin, race, creed, gender, sexual

orientation, and abilities;
